如仇 Support El Rio Health with a Tax Free Gift from your IRA

Nothing is more personal than your health and charitable giving.

You can use the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA Retirement funds to make a tax-free gift to El Rio Health.

If you are 70 ½, you have to take a yearly Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA retirement funds. To avoid paying taxes on that income, you can choose to have the RMD "rolled over" directly to El Rio Health by notifying your IRA administrator. This law allows you to transfer any amount up to \$100,000 from your IRA account directly to a qualified charitable organization, such as El Rio Health, without paying income tax on the distribution.

When you use the IRA RMD to make a charitable gift to El Rio Health:

- Your gift will begin to have an IMPACT today, allowing you to see the difference you are making in patients' lives immediately.
- You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer doesn't generate taxable income or a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your tax deductions.
- If you have not yet taken your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year, your IRA Charitable Rollover Gift can satisfy **all** OR **part** of that requirement.

El Rio Program Updates, New Collaborations and Innovations

• Medical - Legal partnership with Southern Arizona Legal Aid (SALA). In 2018, an attorney team was imbedded at one of the El Rio largest health centers. Together, we provide patients with civil legal assistance and train medical providers on how legal interventions can positively impact patient health. This year, we have screened over 367 patients for the Medical Legal Partnership and have served 160 El Rio patients. Family law, housing law, and social security law are the top three areas for assistance. This year, the team has defended El Rio patients in hearings, negotiated settlements for El Rio patients, and provided advice to patients. Funding for the program was budgeted at \$60,000 annually, however, we have surpassed the budget due to the high



needs of our patients. As we move forward, we need increased funding to serve more patients.

- El Rio Street Outreach Team Six nurse practitioners, along with our medical assistants and navigators, serve vulnerable populations through outreach and engagement in non-profit partner locations including Sister Jose's Women's Center, Casa Maria, Salvation Army Hospitality House, The Center for Opportunity, Teen Challenge, Primavera, and Casa De Vida.
- Southern Arizona Children's Advocacy Center. The Southern Arizona Children's Advocacy Center is partnering with El Rio Health. Referrals for children lacking primary care come through our RN Triage line and we help establish these kids quickly as new patients at Congress Pediatrics.
- El Rio Health Partners with University of Arizona Forge The University of Arizona's, Arizona Forge site will be more than a business incubator when it opens in 2020 at the historic Roy Place Building downtown. The building at 44 N. Stone Ave. previously known as the Arizona Forge Business Innovation Hub, will serve as a nexus between students, faculty, startup founders and corporate innovators, fronted by Startup Tucson. El Rio Health is proud to partner in developing a health and wellness area with a fitness center in a well-windowed corner front area that used to house a UA Bookstore. We will also collaborate on data-driven digital health projects.
- H.S. Lopez Family Foundation Center of Opportunity El Rio Health is working with the H.S. Lopez Family
 Foundation, who are in the process of building a 5,000 square foot building for medical and dental care at the site.
 This will allow for expanded medical and dental care services. The El Rio Foundation is working to help raise funds
 to purchase medical and dental equipment.
- New Lactation Program Shelby Abramson, FNP, Lactation Specialist is clinically assessing mothers and newborns filling a vital community need. She is working in partnership with our midwives and OB-GYN providers for pre-birth interventions.
- Employer Flu Shot Outreach The 2019 El Rio Health Employer Flu Shot Outreach Team vaccinated 2,455 people who work for large employers. Forty-six separate events were held in Pima County for the City of Tucson, Pima County, Tucson Electric Power and Pima Community College.





- **NEW Midwifery Center Accreditation** The newly relocated Midwifery Center on the TMC campus has been accredited through 2022 by the Commission for the Accreditation of Birth Centers. Part of our commitment with the relocation to the TMC campus was to the fidelity of the Birth Center model of care and this accreditation verifies our success.
- Medical Dental Pediatric Embedded Hygienist Program – The expanded

embedded hygienist program helps ensure children seen for medical visits also see a hygienist for a dental screening at the end of the visit. By seeing children early, tooth decay and oral health problems can be averted. A testimony to the success of the integrated teams is the increase in annual dental visits for children, ages 2-20 years. At our Southwest campus this measure has increased from 38% to 56% children seen this year!



 El Rio RHAP Program – El Rio's Reproductive Health Teen Access Program (RHAP) is featured in a new documentary by Brave New Films, funded by the Ford Foundation. It is noted that teen pregnancies in South Tucson have been reduced by 50% with programs such as our El Rio program. You can see the video at: https://vimeo.com/371721340/76023663ac


El Rio Vecinos' Block Party Raises \$119,096 for El Rio's Children's Dental Emergency Fund
