EL RIO HEALTH – GRANT HEALTH CENTER IS NOW OPEN!

After four years of strategic planning, site selection, followed by demolition, and building during the pandemic we are so excited to share that our collective vision is now a reality thanks to the work, commitment, and investments of so many caring people and partners! Located in the former Wells Fargo building at Grant & Dodge, the new 36,000 square foot Health Center offers medical care for children and adults, dental care, behavioral health, midwifery, lab, radiology, pharmacy, patient referrals, eligibility, and wellness services.

El Rio welcomes Brooke Casebolt, RN, Clinic Manger, who joined us from TMC Health and Kristen Moorehead, Associate Clinic Manager who transferred from El Rio RN Care Coordination. Health center hours are M-F from 7am-5pm and Saturdays, 8am-4pm.

We want to thank our many partners who helped make this new health center a reality! El Rio collaborated with BWS Architects to design the building, which was constructed by Lloyd Construction Company, Inc. The leadership of the City of Tucson and input from surrounding neighborhood associations was critical to our planning. Thank you to the 341 donors who invested over \$1M in the new building. The total project cost was \$12.3M. Financing was made possible by New Markets Tax Credit (NMTC) allocations from Urban Research Park CDE, LLC, and Clearinghouse Community Development Financial Institution. The NMTC allocations were funded through Wells Fargo. Dental equipment was partially funded by a federal Oral Health Infrastructure grant #H80CS00230-18-13.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month!

After the last two years of living with a pandemic, many people are realizing that stress, isolation, and uncertainty have taken a toll on their well-being. 1 in 5 people will experience a diagnosable mental health condition in their lives, however 5 out of 5 people will go through a challenging time that affects their mental health. If you know someone who might be struggling to get through tough times, there are simple things that every person can say or do to help.

- Be an active listener- put everything aside and give your complete attention to the person 1 who is talking.
- 2. Ask what you can do- it's tempting to assume that you know what someone needs when they are struggling, but it's more helpful to ask them how you can be supportive.
- 3. Offer to join them-going with someone who is struggling to the grocery store, to walk the dog or to go to the doctor can help them feel a sense of accomplishment.
- Know when more serious help is needed- if you see someone struggling for weeks or 4. months, it may be a sign that they need professional help. Do not be afraid to encourage them to speak to a trained counselor.

"Mission of Hope" – Youth **Mental Health Project Update**

We want to thank the many individuals, foundations and corporate donors who have contributed generous support for our new "Mission of Hope" Youth Mental Health Pilot Project. Multiple action steps are taking place to launch behavioral health services for youth. El Rio hired a child psychiatrist, psychiatric nurse practitioner, behavioral health case manager, and two staffs have transferred from other departments. We are still recruiting for several open positions. The Facilities team worked with a contractor to re-design an area at the El Rio - El Pueblo clinic site to create clinical offices. We completed fingerprinting several hundred employees and are in the process of applying for state licensure to begin services, which we anticipate starting in June.

On April 1st, the Southern Arizona AHEC and El Rio Health held an Adolescent Behavioral Health Summit. Free training was provided to 150 professionals on evidence-based practices to treat adolescents struggling with unprecedented levels of stress. The training included education on Medication Assisted Treatment for adolescent with substance use disorders, positive behavior intervention approaches for youth on the autism spectrum, concepts on adverse childhood experiences including the evolving role of trauma, and identification of the core principles of behavioral integration in a patient-centered medical home.

Angel Charity for Children Partners with El Rio on "Mission of Hope"

Angel Charity for Children General Chair Karen Farrell and Vice Chair Jill Brooks present Kate Breck Calhoun, Anthony Schaefer and Brenda Goldsmith with \$50,000 to help launch the new Youth Mental Health Pilot Project. The pandemic escalated the need for behavioral and mental health services for youth suffering from anxiety, depression, and behavior problems. The program will help **200-300** youth ages 12-18 who have limited resources for treatment.

Dr. La Chance practiced community-based dentistry at El Rio Health for 40+ years. He cared deeply about his patients and making a difference in the lives of others. Greg knew that dentistry was his calling early on. After several years with El Rio, he was promoted to Dental Director. During his career he helped expand dental services from one dental clinic at Congress to seven El Rio sites across Tucson serving thousands of patients. Under his leadership, El Rio became the largest non-profit dental practice in the state of Arizona and remains so today with more than 50,000 visits annually.
